FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

ON THE ROAD TO ZERO

November 2019

Dear friend of Vermont CARES,

We write you this year-end with updates from the front lines of rural HIV and harm reduction, from an organization that's undergone great change over the last 12 months. Our ongoing survival and growth are due in large part to the strong and warm embrace of Vermont, and as winter's chill sets in, we honor and appreciate that Vermont's neighbors take care of one another. This past year has demonstrated how we do so together.

2019 was a challenging year for Vermont CARES: we would not sugarcoat this fact. In January, our core grantor significantly changed how we were funded. While we were made whole over the summer, funds have been coming more slowly and in smaller increments. We planned for this known change thoughtfully, and navigated carefully, but the transition was harder than anticipated, resulting in a financially challenging winter and spring. This impacted our staff and board, and most of all those who we serve, who experienced emergency assistance slowing down, limits on supplies at our syringe service programs, and a temporarily smaller staff.

We are bouncing back, as CARES always does: securing new grants, engaging new donors, inviting new board members, and all the while expanding our vital work to reach thousands at risk of HIV, hepatitis C, overdose death, and the related impacts of the stigmas these risks carry. We served more people living with HIV through case management this year than ever before, and we built inspiring new ways to reduce the stigma of drug use.

Our state is reeling from spreading public health crises, and Vermont CARES is helping ease the burden of trauma for Vermonters who come to our offices and mobile vans having lost friends and loved ones. Because we remain grassroots, nimble, and powerfully human-driven, we have responded as quickly as finances allow with new emergencyresponse interventions. We now offer fentanyl test strips, Vermontfarm-raised herbal wound care kits, free naloxone to all, and rapid referrals to HIV prevention medication for those who need it. Other states are far behind the progress we've made, and each of us should be deeply proud of what we all make possible.

As 2020 approaches, we continue to ask for your contributions - of money, yes - and also of time and passion. Vermont CARES couldn't build a strong network of care and prevention without scores of volunteers and staff deployed across our state, offering free HIV tests, education in schools, and safer use supplies and safety tips in communities we couldn't otherwise serve. Our results are impressive because you - our fully rounded community of supporters - are compassionate.

Please review this annual report with this full context in mind: thanks to you, we remain an organization that embraces change and responds to public health needs resiliently. We appreciate all the ways you have supported us through the more than 30 years Vermont CARES has grown.



REFLECTIONS 2018/2019

It is rare to experience the type of privilege we had when working with Charlotte Malling, who came to us as a junior at the University of Vermont with interest in HIV, global health, and health equity. CARES once in a while is able to share deep experiences with rising leaders, and Charlotte embraced that experience fully and with real impact. As a trained educator, HIV tester, and all-around supporter, she impacted so many facets of our work in a time when we really needed that allyship. While we feel grateful for knowing we got to train this all-star in public health skills and non-judgmental counseling, it's far more a gift knowing that Charlotte, and others of the amazing volunteers who find their way to us, will continue to leave a tremendous mark in the world around her for years to come. Here's some of what she had to report as she moved on to her next chapter of work.



As an Anthropology student at the University of Vermont, I wanted to get involved in an organization locally that would allow me to learn more about public health issues in the greater community. After moving to VT my sophomore year, I connected with Vermont CARES out of respect for their medical case management model that took a holistic approach to client care. I quickly became immersed in many facets of Vermont CARES's operations from small research projects, administrative tasks to tabling at various events in the area. Supporting syringe

service programs throughout rural Vermont and performing testing for HIV/HCV was where I grew tremendously, learning firsthand about important strategies being employed to combat the opioid & AIDS epidemics.In all, I gained the most from being exposed to the vast experience of the many wise staff at Vermont CARES, as the organization deeply values life experience from all different backgrounds. Being able to advocate for your clients' needs from a place of empathy & solidarity is critical to providing strong services that remove barriers to care. After working for VT CARES, I felt strongly about continuing to support an organization that employs a client-focused mission, so post-graduation I am now working in Liberia for the NGO Partners in Health in TB programming. Understanding the social determinants of health is critical to combatting health inequities globally, and I was very privileged to be able to learn this lesson from the incredible work Vermont CARES is doing throughout VT.




